words and silence and amazing music. You like to have fun, trust your leaders, and truly care for each other. I see community organizing, and the feeding and sheltering of people in need. You talk the talk, and walk the walk. The Spirit of Love is truly present here.

Yet there are always new

demands on a growing community, and new ways to serve each other and the world. The financial vision you are holding shows how we want to strengthen our beloved community and its ministries. It is rooted in your hopes and dreams for your congregation, affirmed in surveys and house meetings, and supported by the Board and me.

It takes consistent and abundant giving on the part of all members and friends to sustain our vision and achieve our goals. That means raising our pledge whenever we can—which is why I have committed to a tithe of 10% of my income over the next three years. I hope you will join me in raising *your* pledge as well.

For example, since January we have doubled our giving to social agencies and non-profits by sharing the basket every week. Giving is in our nature here.

Thank you so much for sustaining that vision! May the blessings of life flow to you every day.



Envisioning by the Numbers

The budget figures and projections below may appear as numbers on a page, but in truth, they are what dreams are made of. In the chart below, you will see a projected budget that represents a 6% increase over the current 2014–2015 budget.

WHAT WILL THESE EXTRA FUNDS ALLOW US TO DO? THE FOLLOWING:

- · Expand the director of religious education position from three-quarter to full-time.
- · Hire a part-time intern minister.
- · Establish a new staff retirement plan.
- · Provide modest salary increases to help employees keep pace with the cost of living.
- · Pay hourly workers close or equal to a Sonoma County living wage.
- · Fund Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) and Pacific Central District (PCD) dues at 100%.



IF YOUR GENEROSITY ALLOWS A MORE-THAN-6% INCREASE, THE FOLLOWING MAY ALSO BE POSSIBLE:

- · Financial support for members wishing to attend District Assembly and General Assembly. (\$5,000)
- · A full-time internship. (\$15,000 above part-time budgeted cost)
- · A new position of contract bookkeeper to professionalize this critical function. (\$20,000)
- · Building improvements (for which there is always a Wish List!). (\$20,000)
- · An associate minister to help Chris manage the needs of our growing congregation. (\$65,000)
